Competitive

Idaho Rush has built a professional staff tailored to meet the needs of all its players, regardless of age. Idaho Rush believes that players develop best when they are playing with and against players of like ability, with occasional challenges against a higher level of play. To bring that about, Rush organizes its 400+ competitive players into Nike teams and Swoosh teams beginning with the U13 age group. Players who do not make a Rush competitive team or who choose not to play at that level can register in the Select program. Select

The purpose of the Select program is to provide balanced, competitive play while developing players, coaches and referees without the additional costs and commitment of time required by highly competitive leagues. There is no travel out of town, although some travel in the Boise metro area for practices and games will be required. Players should possess good technical skills and a higher level of dedication to the game. Players are guaranteed 50 percent playing time during the season.

Recreation program

The Recreation program is for beginning soccer players or kids who want to play without the pressure of winning. It is a non-competitive program, meaning we do not keep scores or standings, teams do not travel and there are no extra fees for referees, coaching, etc. The focus is on teaching players the fundamental skills of the game. Families may choose to participate in either the fall or spring seasons, or both. The fall season generally begins shortly after Labor Day, and the spring season generally begins the first week of April. Teams usually play six games over the course of eight weeks. Practices are limited to no more than twice a week at no more than an hour at a time. Practices generally begin two weeks before the first game.
